### Membership Types and Rules

There are 4 types of membership:-

- 1. Full Membership** – these members have access to all Club activities and programmes without further cost with the exception of:-

- Club competitions, whereupon a nominal entry fee will be charged to cover judges' costs
- Show productions, whereupon a contribution towards production costs may be required
- Open competitions organised by DISC, whereupon relevant entry fees will be published.

Full members may enter all Club events and competitions, subject to any ISU/NISA eligibility requirements that may apply to these events and competitions and subject to specific rules that may be devised by the committee, which will be clearly posted prior to the event or competition. Full members, who are 16 years of age or over have voting rights. In order to participate in the annual Show, members must join by 1<sup>st</sup> July each year. All paid up full members are automatically members of IceSkateWales. For 2010-2011 only the Club will pay the IceSkateWales affiliation fee on behalf of its members

**2. Non-skating Membership; -**

- a. This membership is required by parents or guardians of members less than 14 years of age as at 1<sup>st</sup> April each year. At least one parent or guardian must be nominated as a Non-skating member, unless they have joined as a Full or Associate member.
- b. These members have voting rights if they are 16 years of age or over, and may attend all Club sessions. They do not hold any skating rights, unless they wish to take part in an on-ice Club fund-raising event, in which case the Club's published skating fee for that event would apply.

**3. Associate Membership** – these members pay a reduced annual fee and may attend Club sessions with full skating rights, whereupon an additional charge per session will apply. Associate members are not eligible to take part in Club shows. Associate members are not eligible to vote. Associate members under the age of 14 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian, who will be required to join as a Non-skating member.

**4. Honorary Life Membership** – The Committee may nominate, and the Annual General Meeting endorse, Life Members to honour those who have given outstanding meritorious service to the Club. Such Members may not, subject to Rule 11 of the Club's Constitution and Rules, have their Life Membership revoked and shall not be required to pay a subscription. Such members shall have the privileges of Full Membership.

### **Payment Options**

The financial and membership year shall commence on **1<sup>st</sup> April and end on 31<sup>st</sup> March**. Club Membership is to be paid by any of the following means; -

- 1) One annual Payment, payable by 1<sup>st</sup> May.
- 2) Two half yearly payments, the first by 1st May, the second by 1<sup>st</sup> November.
- 3) Twelve monthly payments, the first commencing in April.

**New** Full members joining during the year will be charged pro-rata. There is no pro-rata reduction for Associate members or Non-skating members who join during the year.

### **How to Pay**

New members must pay/set up the standing order at the same time as completing a new membership form. New and continuing members must complete a membership form each year. Standing Order forms are available with the DISC bank details already entered. They may be set up on line or once completed these forms must be given to the member's bank in order for the standing order to be set up.

### **Club Sessions**

Times of club sessions will be displayed on the Club notice board and Club website. The club aims to provide at least 40 bi-weekly sessions throughout the year. The Club cannot accept any liability for the loss of Club ice time as a result of Deeside Leisure Centre arrangements or as a result of failure of the rink plant.
